

Election Worker Positions & Amount You Could Earn

You will need to have enough people to staff the following positions. Also included is the amount each position pays, which would be how much your group would be paid for each worker in that position.

Clerk \$300-\$350 varies as to location size

The clerk is responsible for the overall management of the polling place. He/She ensures order is maintained and the Election Board performs its duties correctly. The clerk also picks up supplies prior to the election and returns them on Election Night.

Voter Information Specialist \$250

This person processes the appropriate forms to update the record of an eligible voter, and communicates with Elections Headquarters to resolve questions pertaining to a voter's eligibility to vote.

Technical Support Operator \$250

This person provides technical support to the polling place and assists voters with equipment and also uploads results on Election Night.

EVID Operator \$200

This person verifies the voter is eligible to vote in the precinct and issues a voter pass or refers the voter to the clerk.

Poll Deputy \$175

This person is stationed outside the voting room on Election Day to maintain order at the polling place and by monitoring the 100 foot No Solicitation Zone. Greets voters and reminds them to have their photo and signature IDs ready. They are sworn in as a temporary Sheriff's Office deputy. Background checks are run.

Adopt-A-Precinct Program

What Is It?

The Adopt-A-Precinct program allows your organization to help with and be a part of the election process as well as earn money for your group.

You provide the manpower and enthusiasm and we will provide you with the necessary training and pay your group the set rate for the different positions filled by your volunteers.

You will need seven to 10 volunteers to staff the polling place during an election. This includes someone to serve as a clerk, voter information specialist, technical operator, a minimum of two EVID operators and a poll deputy.

Benefits to Your Group

We will display a sign outside the polling place with your organization’s name to promote the community service your group is providing.

Your organization’s or business’ name will be placed on our Community Partners Wall at the Supervisor of Elections office.

Your group will also be paid for their time. Your organization or business can make \$3,000 to \$5,500 in an election cycle by fully staffing a polling location.

How to Get Started

All workers must be registered to vote and attend a one-hour orientation class.

You will need a person to coordinate at least seven to 10 volunteers, depending on the size of the polling location you adopt.

Each polling site is required to have a minimum of one bilingual person. If your organization cannot provide this person, the elections office will assist you by staffing this person.

We will try to assign you a polling location in an area of your choice.

We will provide all training, which is mandatory per state law. Training must be done before each election and lasts, on average, from two to eight hours depending on the position.

Election workers will begin working at 6 a.m. and stay until all the work is complete after the closing of the polls at 7 p.m.

Election workers are asked to bring food and necessities with them for the entire day, as they may not leave the polling place during the day.

Election workers are asked to wear comfortable, neat casual business attire. Your workers may wear shirts with your organization’s logo, but they will not be allowed to wear any electioneering or political attire.
