

Election Worker Positions

Clerk: \$300—\$350

- Manages the operations of the polling place in accordance with Florida law.
- Communicates with the elections office to resolve voter eligibility questions.
- Picks up supplies before Election Day
- Follows procedures to open and close the polling place
- Returns required election materials to the elections office on Election Night

Voter Information Specialist: \$250

- Processes the appropriate forms to update the record of an eligible voter
- Communicates with the elections office to resolve voter eligibility questions
- Assists with opening and closing duties

Technical Support Operator: \$250

- Sets up and maintains election equipment
- Assists voters using the tabulation equipment and hands out "I Voted" stickers
- Uploads results on Election Night
- Must be comfortable working with electronic equipment
- Responsible for setup and breakdown of voting equipment

EViD Operator: \$200

- Processes voters at check-in using an electronic poll book.
- Issues a ballot to a qualified voter
- Directs voters with eligibility questions to the Voter Information Specialist
- Assists with opening and closing duties

Poll Deputy: \$175

- Assists voters entering and exiting the polling room
- Monitors the 100' No Solicitation Zone
- Assists with opening and closing duties
- Maintains order at the polling location
(Poll Deputies must be cleared through the Osceola County Sheriff's office)

Dear Community Leader:

As Osceola County's Supervisor of Elections, I would like to invite businesses, non-profits, schools and community service groups to participate in our Adopt-A-Precinct program, a partnership that encourages civic participation in the election process.

Each participating organization or business can take part by "adopting" a polling location on Election Day. Your organization provides the personnel to staff the election workers at a precinct on Election Day. The elections office will then write a check to the organization rather than pay the individual workers. These funds could be used towards worthy causes in which the organization is involved and the public is served by having qualified workers at the polling place.

In our 2018 election cycle, over \$47,000 was distributed to organizations participating in our Adopt-A-Precinct program!

What is the Adopt-A-Precinct Program?

The Adopt-A-Precinct program is a partnership in which a participating organization adopts a specific precinct the day of the election. Your organization recruits volunteers to be election workers on Election Day. We train your volunteers and assign them to a polling place. After the election, a check is written to the organization that reflects the pay for the positions your volunteers worked.

How Many Workers are Needed?

The number of workers needed are determined by the size of the polling location. Usually seven to 10 workers are needed per location. Of those workers, one to four will need to be bilingual in Spanish. Our office can supply these workers if you can't meet the requirements. However, your group will not receive pay for workers we have to place.

Election Workers Must:

- ✓ Be a registered voter in the State of Florida
- ✓ Read, write and communicate in English
- ✓ Be composed of members representing more than one political party
- ✓ Be able to work a 14-hour day
- ✓ Be non-partisan on Election Day

What are the Training Requirements?

Florida law requires all election workers to attend mandatory training, both online and in the classroom. The amount of required training varies and is based on the position served at the location. Morning, evening and weekend classes provide multiple training options.

How To Get Started!

- Complete the Adopt-A-Precinct Interest Form.
- Once your organization has been approved to become an Adopt-A-Precinct group, you will be assigned a polling location.
- Recruit volunteers! The elections office will provide you with the number of workers you will need. Usually seven to 10 workers (including bilingual workers)
- Your workers will be invited to attend a one hour orientation class where they will be briefed on important election rules and laws along with completing paperwork.
- We provide the training and class scheduling.
